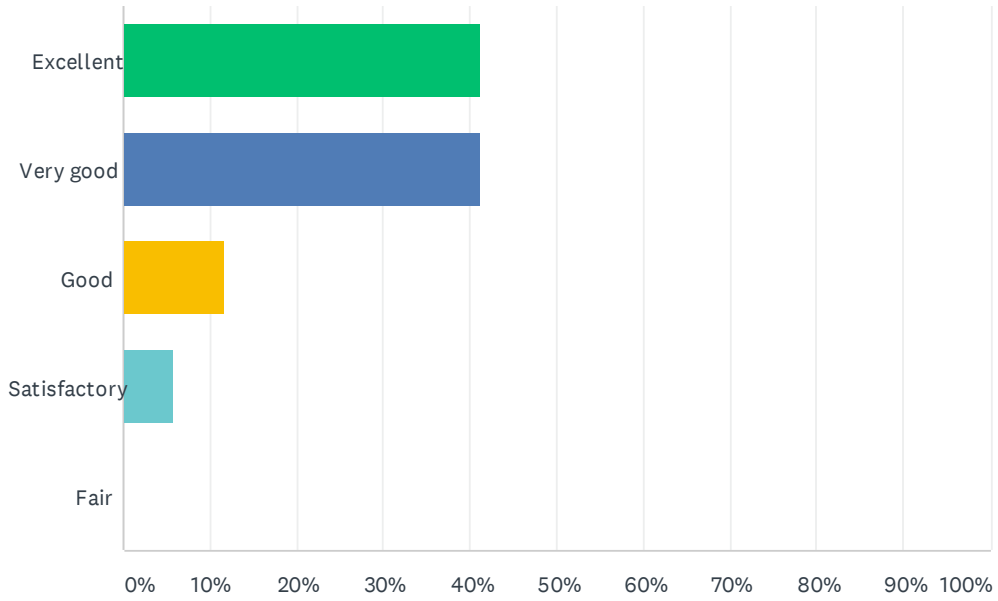


Q1 How likely is it you would recommend this course to a colleague?

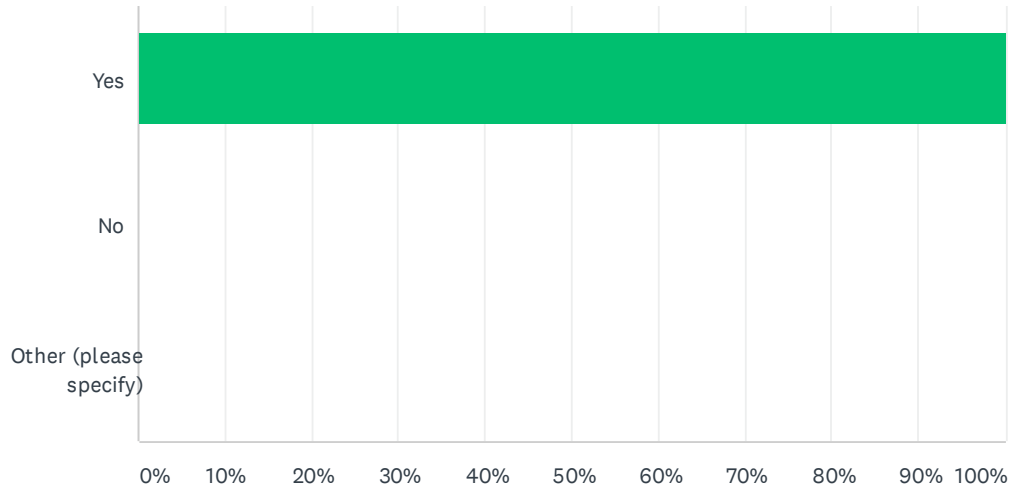

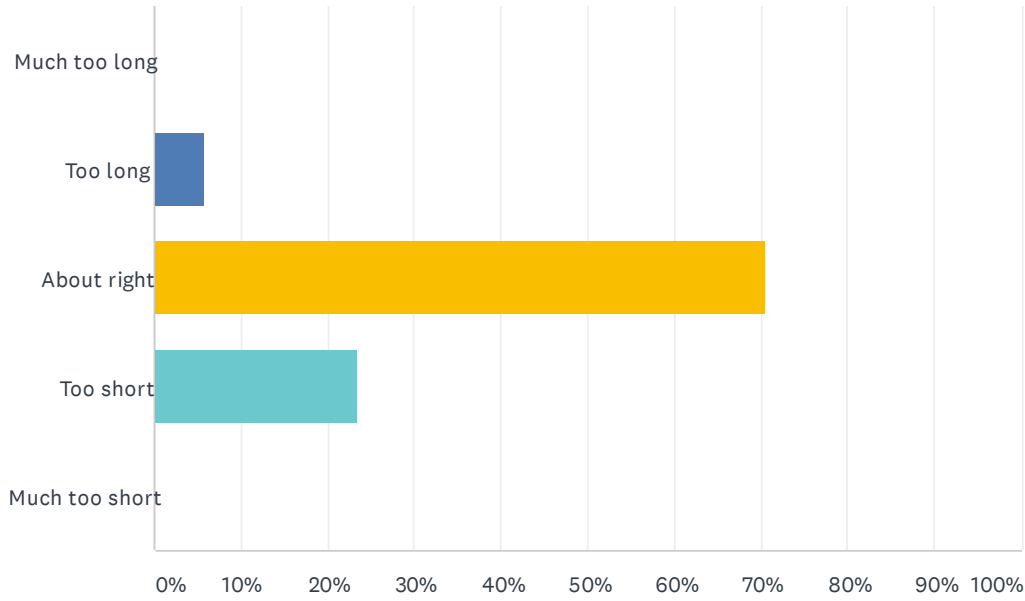

Q3 Was the course too long, too short or just about right?

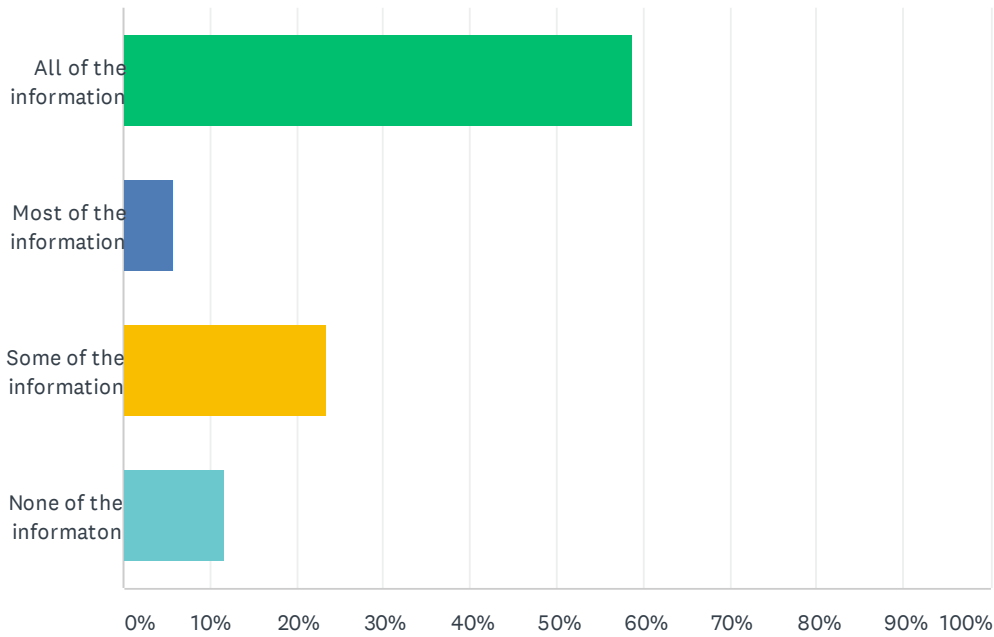

Q4 Prior to the event, how much of the information that you needed did you get?

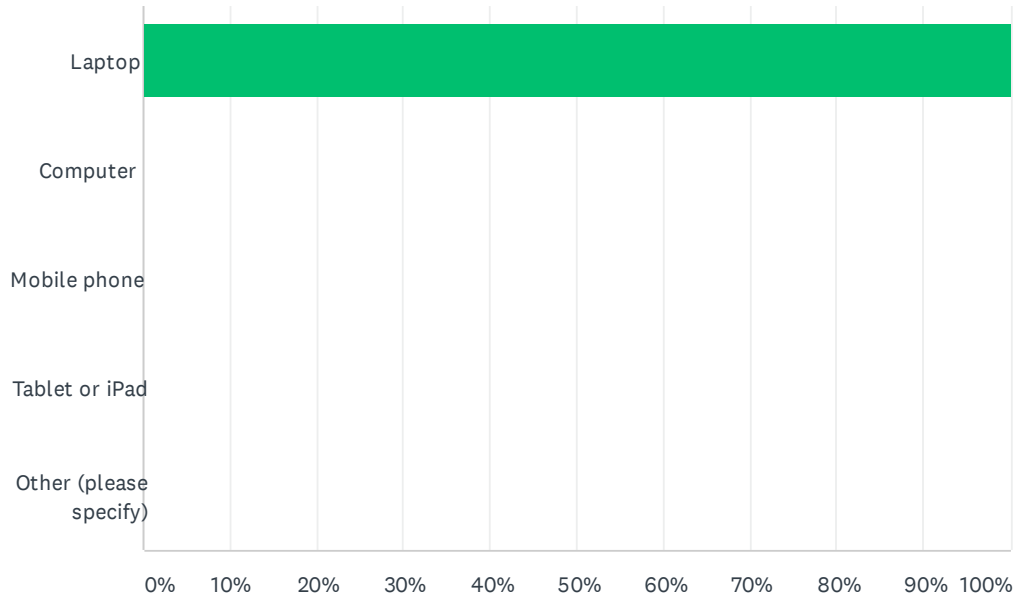

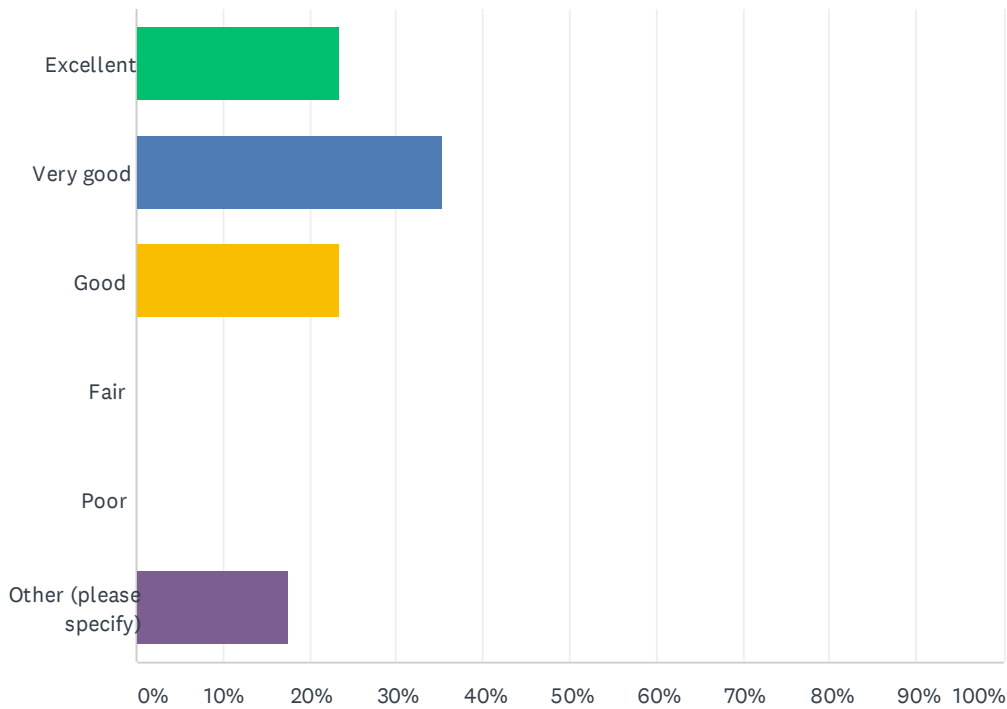

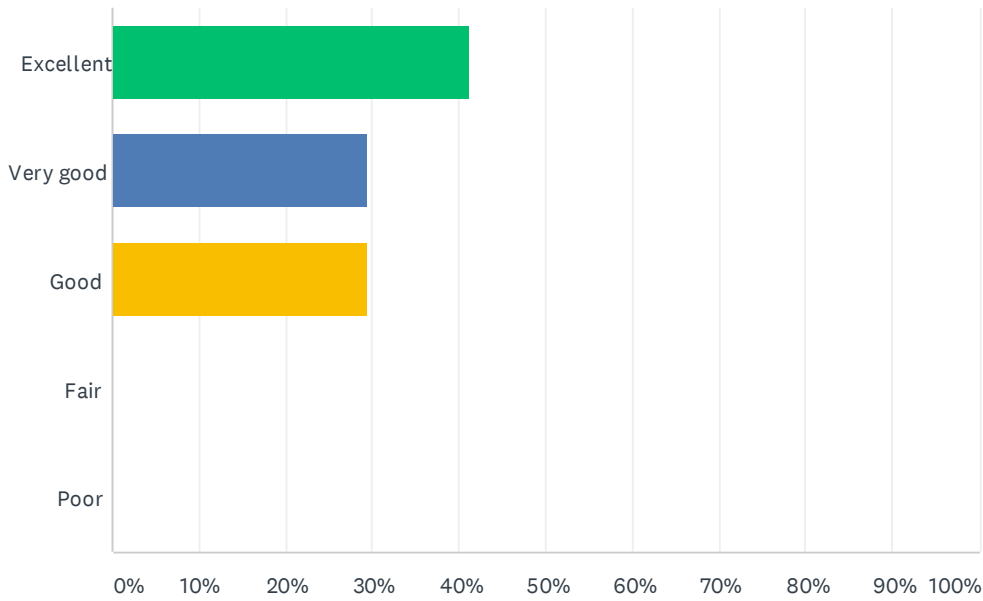
